The second meeting is a joint meeting with the North West Geotechnical Group of the ICE. This is a fantastic chance to hear this years Rankine Lecture on Tunnelling and Geotechnics.

The Quiz Night format is back for just before Christmas and we hope that you and your colleagues can raise a team to enjoy a relaxing evening before the frantic Christmas Period.

Also, this year we have a Careers event and joint meetings to encourage better links with our local universities. In celebration of 200 years of the Geological Society we are arranging a Dinner Dance at the spectacular Manchester Town Hall. We very much hope that this will be a special event where geologists from the region can relax, listen to interesting speakers and realise what a vibrant community of geologists there is in North West England.
