


More pages are coming soon, including a redesigned e-Maps section for links to online mapping worldwide.

The BGS Bedrock geology map of the United Kingdom and Ireland is now available as a 1000 piece jigsaw, and comes with a full-size folded copy of the map. Published in 2017, the map shows an overview of the bedrock geology of the UK and Ireland using modern data.

Save Charles Lyell's notebooks - update

You may recently have received a mailing from us regarding the University of Edinburgh's campaign to save Charles Lyell's notebooks, which are due to be sold to an unknown buyer overseas.

The University of Edinburgh is raising funds to purchase and conserve them, and make them available on-line for free to the public. With over 800 generous pledges and the University's contribution they have now raised over £610,000.

A temporary export ban, imposed by the UK government, has been extended to a final 15th October deadline. Additionally, it has been confirmed with HMRC (the UK tax authority) and other parties that a

Private Treaty Sale for the notebook collection has been agreed. By arranging for the tax to be removed from the sale the purchase price has been reduced from £1,444,000 to £966,000.

The revised deadline and target make ultimate success a very real possibility.
